

I'm pleased to share recent updates from Nashua Children's Home and how your support continues to impact the children and families we serve. The past few months have brought both exciting developments and challenges, all rooted in our mission to provide a safe, nurturing environment.

One of our key initiatives over the last few months has been Career Readiness and Life Skills for the older youth in our Transitional Living Program (TLP), with a key emphasis on overcoming transportation barriers. Recently, we purchased two used vehicles for young adults entering the TLP, and our staff continue supervised driving for those working toward obtaining their licenses.

Like many organizations, we've faced challenges and uncertainty, but thanks to strong community support and the resilience of our staff, we have been able to adapt and remain focused on our mission. In the coming months we'll transition to an electronic medical records system to streamline records processing in an effort to better serve the children in our care.

Lastly, I am excited to announce that we will be hosting our first-ever fundraiser gala on Saturday, October 4, 2025, to be held at the Event Center Nashua. Please check our website in the coming weeks for more information about this exciting event!

Aging Out, But Not Alone

Serving our "aged-out" youth

Imagine spending most of your childhood or teenage years at Nashua Children's Home. Now, as you turn 18, you're suddenly considered an adult—no longer part of the child-protective or juvenile justice system.

But where do you go next? With no family to turn to for support, no bed to call your own, and no one to guide you through adulthood, the future can feel overwhelming.

We recognized this critical need and, in 2002, established the Transitional

Living Program (TLP) to prevent homelessness and provide stability for young adults aging out of care. Nearly entirely funded by private donations and grants, the TLP offers a structured path toward independence.

At the heart of the program is Lea Reilly, the TLP's program director since its inception. An onsite apartment building gives these young adults a place to call home for a few more years. During this time, they pay a nominal rent while receiving other essential support, including:

- guidance on navigating adulthood—finding a job, enrolling in community college, and managing daily responsibilities
- help securing transportation, which can include having their own used car to get to their job, school, and grocery store
- ongoing mentorship in budgeting, apartment living, and setting sustaining life goals

Being onsite allows these young adults to stay connected to their Nashua Children's Home family while they gain the confidence and skills to live independently.
